
1. Overview of Ireland

About Ireland	
Where is Ireland?	Ireland is located in Western Europe, occupying five-sixths of the island of Ireland in the North Atlantic Ocean, west of Great Britain
Population (millions)	4.9 (2019)
Time Difference	South Africa is 1 hour ahead of Ireland in summer and 2 hours ahead of Ireland in winter.
Language	English and Gaelic are the official languages
General Overview	Amidst the COVID-19 pandemic, Ireland's economic outlook is subject to considerable uncertainty.
	Consumer expenditure per capita in Ireland amounted to USD 23,040 in 2019, and is forecast to grow at an average annual rate of 3,4% through to 2030. In 2019, real disposable income per capita amounted to USD 26,068.
	The country's population was around 4,9 million in 2019 and is expected to reach 5,6 million by 2040. Ireland has one of the youngest populations in Europe, with a median age of 37,6 years. The fertility rate is stable at 1,8 births per female.
	Per capita gross income in Ireland is forecast to increase by 64% in real terms over 2021-2040. Late Lifers are projected to become predominant in the top-income band by 2040, shaping luxury spending patterns in Ireland.
	Outbound departures reached 2 613 000 trips in 2020, declining by 74,3% from 2019. By 2026 the number of outbound trips is expected to recover to 2019 levels with a forecast expenditure of EUR 10 138 300.
	South Africa is the most visited African destination for Irish travellers. Trips from Ireland to South Africa made up 0,3% of all outbound trips in 2019 and 2020.


OUTBOUND DEPARTURES FROM IRELAND, 2016 - 2020



4.1. Visitor Arrivals to the Western Cape


Irish visitor arrivals to the Western Cape reached its peak in 2018 increasing by 8,6% from its 2017 figure. A decline -35,5% followed in 2019, and the decrease in tourist arrivals continued into 2020.

4.2. Passenger Traffic through Cape Town International Airport

Passengers through Cape Town International Airport from Ireland were highest over the period November 2019 to February 2020. However, due to travel restrictions brought on by the COVID-19 pandemic, passenger arrivals decreased dramatically throughout 2020 and have remained low into 2021.

5. Key Findings

- The COVID-19 pandemic has caused sharp declines in both inbound and outbound tourism flows as well as commercial activity across Ireland.
- Outbound departures declined by 64,6% in 2020 from the previous year. By 2024 the number of outbound trips is expected to recover to 2019 levels.
- South Africa is the most visited African destination for Irish travellers. Trips from Ireland to South Africa made up 0,3% of all outbound trips in 2019 and 2020.
- Travellers from Ireland to South Africa are predominantly visiting for holiday purposes or to visit family and friends. A fair amount also visited for Business and Meetings, Incentives, Conferences and Events (MICE) in 2019 and 2020.
