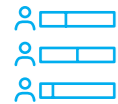

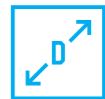
Population

South Africa is the **24th largest** country by area, with the **25th largest population**, the **33rd largest economy** by GDP, **30th** by PPP, and ranks **19th in foreign debt** (Economist Pocket World 2020 – comparing 190 countries)



Borders

South Africa is bordered by the **Indian** and **Atlantic Oceans** on three sides. To the north, it shares borders with **Namibia**, **Botswana**, **Zimbabwe**, and **Mozambique**. **Eswatini** and **Lesotho** are two **independent landlocked** countries within its borders



Languages

South Africa has **11 official languages** of which three are spoken in the Western Cape. **English** is predominantly used in business and education



Capital Cities

Cape Town is the judicial capital
Pretoria is the administrative capital
Bloemfontein is the legislative capital



Political Landscape

The first democratic elections were held in 1994. The leading political party is the **African National Congress (ANC)** with the official opposition being the **Democratic Alliance (DA)**



Religion

Almost **80%** of South Africa's population is Christian with the other **20%** is Hindu, Muslim, Buddhist, or other religions



Tertiary Education

26 universities with estimated at **1 million** enrolled students



Climate

South Africa's climate ranges from **Mediterranean** in the southwest to temperate inland and **subtropical** in the northeast, with a small **desert area** in the northwest. Most regions enjoy **warm, sunny days** and **cool nights**



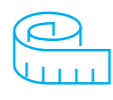

Visas

South Africa maintains a well-defined and structured visa application process to facilitate the entry of international visitors, including delegates attending professional and scientific congresses. The Department of Home Affairs (DHA) governs all entry regulations, with many

nationalities from Africa, the Americas, Asia, and Europe eligible for visa-free entry for up to 90 days.

Health Requirements

No vaccinations are required for cholera, smallpox or malaria. If arriving from a yellow fever zone, you must have a valid international yellow fever inoculation certificate. Due to the threat of malaria contamination, preventative medication is necessary for the northern parts of South Africa and is obtainable from all pharmacies in South Africa. Cape Town and the Western Cape is a non-malaria area.
